CLUB NIGHTS

Riders Test @ Greenfields 25th March – From 7pm

Copies of the tests were enclosed with the Febuary newsletter. If you don't have one get in touch and I'll send you one (clarehiggins80@hotmail.com)

Remember the judge is marking the rider rather than the horse in this competition so you do not need to have a 'dressage' horse to compete successfully (not sure if that's a good thing!). They are looking for a correct position and use of the aids. Test 6 is not at all complicated and is just basic movements at walk, trot and canter. Test 8 is a bit more difficult and includes a turn on the forehand and simple changes of leg in canter. Still, you're among friends so why not have a go at 8 instead of 6 this year.

Details/Eligibility:

Steward: TBC

Class 1 – Intro – Riding Test 6(2003) - for riders that have never been placed in any Dressage or Riding Test competitions (excepting PCRA Club Nights).

Class 2 – Novice – Riding Test 6(2003) - restricted to horses with no more than 5 BD points and riders who do not hold AI or above. The same rider/horse combination cannot compete in this if they have already won it twice.

Class 3 – Open – Riding Test 8(2004) - no restrictions.

Club trophies are awarded to the winners of Classes 2 and 3 provided they joined before the end December deadline, failing which the trophy will be awarded to the highest placed Club Member eligible.

Cost: £5

Booking: Pre-entry only. Please phone Sheona McNeill anytime to book a place and also phone Sheona on Monday 23rd for your time.

You can only compete in one test although you may be able to go HC in another if there are places.

April 29th @ Maidenhill, Newton Mearns – Marksman, Idyll Art, Shand Show Jumping

This will be run again as a four event competition as it was well received and attended last year. Trophies are awarded to the horse and rider combinations who have gained the most points in their best three out of the four nights provided they joined before the end December deadline, failing which the trophy will be awarded to the highest placed Club Member eligible. The night starts with Clear Round at approx. 2' 3" and the heights will rise gradually throughout the following 3 classes. The maximum for the 1st round of the Open will be 3ft and probably closer to 2'9"

Stewards: TBC

Details/Eligibility: riders must be paid up members of the club prior to the commencement of the class.

There are no restrictions on the Idyll Art (intermediate) and Shand (open) but to compete in the Marksman (novice) the horse and rider combination **must NEVER have won 3 firsts in any SJ competitions or have won £5**. You can compete in 2 classes, one of which must be the Idyll Art (excluding Clear Round).

Cost: TBC

Booking: Pre-booking is not required but please note that CR will be for strictly half an hour from 7.00 p.m. to 7.30 p.m. so be there in plenty of time if you want to ride in the CR first. The Novice class will start promptly at 7.30 and those who have paid for a CR but not presented at the gate will have their fee refunded.

May 13th @ Maidenhill, Newton Mearns – Style Jumping (used to be called Equitation Jumping)

He has 13 BD points from only a few outings so can continue in Prelim tests for a while if required, where he is rarely out of the top three. Although excelling in dressage, Mikey is certainly a Ridden Hunter prospect given his conformation and way of going. He hasn't done much jumping, mostly due to rider nerves but has schooled over pre-novice fences at Houston and competed in a few unaffiliated SJ and Working Hunter classes. Mikey is fine to shoe, clip and box

and hacks out alone or in company. He is fit and ready to go now and a superb prospect for a relatively experienced rider, particularly someone interested in dressage. This is a very reluctant sale.
